# Speaker Bios



#### **Matt Aston**

Prior to joining HDR he was the U.S. Government's Senior Rail Advisor in Iraq, where he assisted the Iraqi Republic Railways with its resumption to commercial service and directed the U.S. Government's \$250 million reconstruction program for the railway. Previously, he was Editor of Trains Magazine, managed a locomotive leasing company, and dispatched trains for Kansas City Southern Railway. At HDR, Mark principally consults on strategic projects for Class 1 and short line railroads, transportation service plans and freight railroad coordination for commuter and state-supported intercity and passenger rail newstarts and expansions, and economic analysis and development of rail projects for railroads, public agencies, ports, and shippers. Mark has a Master's Degree in History from the University of Illinois and lives in Camas, Washington (on weekends). Mark serves on AREMA's Operations and PTC committees, and on TRB's Railroad Operating Technology Committee.

Mr. Jessome is CEO of Transmission Developers Inc. and, along with John Douglas, is a co-founder. referred to as Aquabank™. This strategy included the development of economic models and programs for the sale of energy, capacity and renewable attributes for both the regulated and market-based energy markets. In addition, Mr. Jessome was responsible, along with the CEO, for raising equity financing for Riverbank's development plans. Mr. Jessome is a board member of Riverbank Power.
